#### **CHURCH PROFILES**

### PERFECTLY CONNECTED

You've probably been to Hillingdon. On average 191,200 people visit our corner of west London every day.

Heathrow is the fifth busiest airport in the world and sits proudly at the base of London's second largest borough, Hillingdon. We can thank the airport for another of our prized statistics: each of the 107 languages defined by the 2011 Census are spoken in Hillingdon; nowhere else in the country can say that (nor in so many ways).

CROWN CHURCH Hillingdon

Brunel University carries on this multicultural theme in the heart of the borough; it is the 14th 'most international' university on the planet. Home to more than 15.000 full-time

students from 110 countries, it's London's biggest single-campus university and just a few minutes' walk from our Sunday meeting venue. If you arrive at Brunel this year and make that short walk to visit us on a Sunday, you'll find a very diverse collective of nearly 300 people, welcoming and worshipping with a lot of warmth.

Reflecting the diversity of the place we live in is something we put a high value on. One of our favourite moments in corporate worship last year was having ten people from different nations, covering every continent except the very cold one, reading a few lines each in their own language of the crucifixion and resurrection story. It was powerful. The gospel is powerful.

There's still lots of work to do; we want as much diversity economically as ethnically, and we don't have anyone yet from the huge Somali community in the east of the borough. Reaching that community is probably as big a task as when in 2009 six adults and seven children were sent from Crown to plant a church in Istanbul. After two years of language learning, the Turkish-speaking 'Yasam Kilisesi' (Life Church) was planted. Living up to the name, they are now ready to support an imminent second Istanbul plant and are a source of joy and



encouragement for us as we look to reach our growing, changing neighbourhoods.

In a few years' time, more than 2,000 new homes will have been built on old RAF bases in the borough and Crossrail will have cut our journey time into central London down to just 16 minutes. There's a lot of investment flowing into the area, and developers will boast of Hillingdon as being 'perfectly connected'. There's also a lot of lonely people, though, and lots of social issues that money isn't fixing.

You'll probably come to Hillingdon sometime in future. We're praying that each time you do, more people here will have been connected to God's people.

#### HASTINGS



# BREAKTHROUGH MOMENTS OF EMOTIONAL HEALING

I had a terribly traumatic birth with my daughter in February 2012 and felt very distant to God and disappointed in Him. I was asking questions such as: Where was He when that happened? Why did He allow it?

I felt completely numb inside to everybody including God. A counsellor specialising in after birth trauma explained to me that I had post-traumatic stress. The help I got felt so surface; I knew I needed deeper healing! I had to surrender my hurt to God as nothing else touched the pain I had locked inside myself. When I did this I wasn't expecting Him to show Himself so clearly...

I had some amazing breakthrough moments: I sobbed my 'hurt' out in church one Sunday and felt like I had literally been sobbing into God's neck. Even though a lady was praying for me it felt like just me and Him. He cared for me and I finally felt that for myself for the first time.

A few months later I went to a women's conference at Everyday Church Wimbledon. During prayer I worked through a lot of pain and forgave many people. I was also released from a fear that had gripped me following a vivid dream I had a week after having my baby. The video loop of the birth that had been going on continually in my head also disappeared that day. I was exhausted, but free!

One of the things that I really want to see in our New Ground family of churches is everyone playing their part.

The danger from the past is that we've locked ourselves into elders or staff or those we've appointed as leader doing everything. But if Jesus said the harvest is ready but the workers are few, then obviously we need more workers! I think the workers are already there in our churches, so the issue is how we get to grips with releasing people to play their part.

For example, I think there needs to be a move for women to really fulfil all the gifts that God has given them. William Booth of the Salvation Army said 50 per cent of his army was women, and that's true in our churches too, so we need to make sure women are increasingly at the forefront.

Another group is single people – for a long time we have acted as though people need to be married to be in leadership, but singleness is not a disqualification but an opportunity. It's well worth having a thorough look at all we're doing at the moment and asking: why we haven't we got single people doing these things? Obviously there are times when a married couple would be more appropriate, but only a few times.

Diversity in leadership is an area in which we need to grow. More and more of our churches are increasingly diverse, which is wonderful. Twenty to 30 per cent of people in my church are not white, but our leadership team doesn't yet reflect that. We simply have got to move away from white middle-class dominated church life.

We've got a lot of people not doing much because we're not releasing them. We



need to look at why women, single people and non-white people aren't being used as much, because people are seeing something modelled that doesn't help them or us at all. We need to challenge ourselves about whether it is because of some kind of hidden bias or "they're not like us" mentality. I am certain that if we really release women and single people and non-white people, they will come up with creative things we're not thinking of!



Singleness is not a disqualification but an

opportunity

We need to keep plugging away in this area, teaching people and speaking into it until everyone in New Ground has got the message that women and singles and non-white people can lead! This is crucial for the future of New Ground and for all that God has called us to do, so please know that whoever you are, whatever your background or circumstances, you have a

part to play!


